Attendance

Consistency is critical! Absences will affect your course grade.

Relationship building

Duration: 2-3 minutes

Content: Making personal connections with the student

Data collection: What did the student tell you? Write it down!

• Ex: Favorite color, food, sport

Ex: Upcoming plans or events

Importance: Increases student motivation and trust

Regular, consistent attendance is key!



Beginning the tutoring session

Relationship building

State goal: Clearly explain what students will be learning

Introduce vocabulary:

- What terms are essential for the lesson?
- Clearly define each term



Explicit instruction

Gradual release of responsibility

- I do: Model the skill
 - Explicit, step-by-step instructions
 - Think aloud
- We do: Guided practice
 - Prompts and feedback throughout
- You do: Independent practice
 - Fade prompts and supports

Multiple opportunities to practice!



Ending the tutoring session

Summarize the session!

- Final questions for understanding
- Review essential vocabulary

Evaluate student progress and areas for growth

Determine next steps
